

Tactical Street Medicine Course for Law Enforcement

It is one in the morning, backup is on its way, you and your partner have come under fire. How could things get worse? It is just then you realized that your partner has been shot. You know EMS will not respond to the scene until the active Shooter threat is resolved. It is all up to you to save your partner's life. Do you have the skills to hold on until EMS is cleared to reach you? If not, then this is the course for you!

The Tactical Street Medicine Course for Law Enforcement taught by a current SWAT Medic is designed to provide officers with the medical skill sets, knowledge and confidence required to evaluate and stabilize a Life-Threatening injury that may be sustained in the course of their duties. This course teaches law enforcement officers, the basic medical care interventions that will help save an injured responder's life until EMS practitioners can safely enter a tactical scene. This course will teach you what medical equipment you should carry and how to use each piece of equipment. The course combines the principles of Pre-Hospital Trauma Life Support (PHTLS) and Tactical Combat Casualty Care (TCCC), with the training provided to military medics by all branches of our Armed Services. Using the MARCH principal this course is uniquely suited for all areas of police work from traffic stops to SWAT call outs.

Students will be instructed on how and when to use pressure dressings, tourniquets, NPA's, thermal warming covers and hemostatic agents.
