Illicit fentanyl analogs have drastically contributed up to 80% of drug overdose/poisonings, a record increase of over 113,000 predicted deaths in the United States as of August 2023. These deadly substances can be up to 10,000 times more potent than Morphine, mixed into illicit street drugs and mass produced into millions of counterfeit pills containing fentanyl and other toxic chemicals. This tuition-free, 8-hour Multijurisdictional Counterdrug Task Force Training course is intended for uniform law enforcement, undercover narcotic investigators, correctional, probation, parole, regulatory, and supervisory personnel and provides a comprehensive overview of the dangers of fentanyl substances, situational awareness, prevention safety considerations and case study reviews of accidental close-call drug exposures to first responders and much more.
