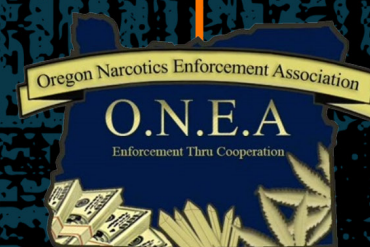

THE UNDERWORLD OF SOCIAL MEDIA

DAY 1

Michele Stuart of JAG Investigations is a nationally recognized expert in open-source intelligence (OSINT). Her instruction will focus on the practical use of publicly available information to support investigative goals, including suspect identification, background development, pattern analysis, and lead generation. Attendees will learn how to locate, interpret, and preserve valuable data from a wide range of digital sources, how to identify suspects hiding behind anonymous usernames and phone numbers, and how to locate suspect social media accounts, among other tactics.

DAY 2

Tim Gooler of GBG Consulting, a current California Property Crimes Detective, will present on social media investigations. Drawing on his extensive training and experience, Tim will discuss the current landscape of social media-related crime, essential tactics, strategies, and tools for social media investigations, and how to effectively use the legal process (warrants, pen registers, wiretaps, emergency disclosures, and more) to gather valuable digital evidence. He will also cover investigative techniques used to exploit major platforms like Facebook and Instagram. Special focus will be placed on IP addresses, VOIP, and text messaging applications, including the use of undercover social media accounts with legal and ethical safeguards, as well as peer-to-peer payment apps such as CashApp and Venmo. Additionally, emphasis will be given to report writing, evidence handling, and case presentation.

DAY 3

Chris Iverson of Cracking the Digital Case and current Oregon Narcotics Detective will provide an in-depth look at some of the most common communication platforms used by criminals, including SnapChat, TikTok, and WhatsApp, and what to expect when serving legal processes on them. Students will discuss cryptocurrency and how to effectively use it for undercover social media operations. Additionally, the training will explore often-overlooked sources of evidence beyond social media accounts, such as Google and Apple accounts along with cellular records, and how these can be used to connect social media accounts, uncover evidence, and either support or expand the scope of an investigation.
